## PRESS RELEASE

For Release on 12/10/2010

On Thursday, December 09, 2010 at 9:14 AM, the Milton Police responded to the scene of a two-vehicle crash on Oakland Station Road in the Town of Georgia. Milton Police were interested in one of the vehicles involved, which was a red Jeep because it matched the description of a vehicle seen in the area of a daytime residential burglary that occurred in Milton the previous day. The suspect forcibly entered the unoccupied house in Milton and stole high-end electronic devices and Christmas gifts.

At the time of the crash, the Vermont State Police (St. Albans barracks) were also investigating an incident where a homeowner returned home to find a male exiting his house. The male that committed the burglary sped away in a red Jeep with the homeowner in pursuit.

The chase ended with a collision between the two vehicles on Oakland Station Road in Georgia. The burglar was identified as Jason P. Trombley (age: 30) of Milton, VT. The homeowner was identified as Bryan A. Bevins (age: 27) of Ethan Allen Highway, Georgia, VT.

With the cooperation of the Colchester Police, further investigation showed that Trombley committed numerous burglaries in Milton, Colchester, Essex and Georgia since his release from the correctional center. Some of those burglaries were committed on Duffy Road, Sanderson Road, Whitney Place, Bear Trap Road, US Route 7 and Rollin Irish Road in Milton. As well as Lost Nation Road in Essex and Middle Road, and Jasper Mine Road in Colchester.

Police recovered nearly \$32,000 in stolen property in the investigation. This property linked Trombley to recent burglaries in the area over the last month. There was substantial evidence to show the recent crimes Trombley committed were a result of an Oxycontin addiction and he had traded the stolen property for drugs around the area.

Jason Trombley was recently released from the correctional center after serving a prison term for multiple burglaries in Milton several years ago. He had served time for multiple charges of Grand Larceny after he stole multiple ATM machines throughout Chittenden County in 2009.
